'Money Week' Feb 24th - Feb 28th

Across school children engaged in different learning around the theme of 'Money', from exploring coins and their values to working out amounts and working within budgets.



"In Braddan Bridge we looked at 1 p, 2p and 5p coins and created a shop to work out how to buy different items. The children then extended this into the role play area,

adding their own price tags to different toys and buying them from each other."



Bray Hill pupils chose a favourite pancake and collected money from the purse to pay the café owner, who checked the right amount before allowing them to 'have' the pancake.

Union Mills explored sorting, matching and counting coins to buy toys.













In Crosby class Howie found it challenging to count money whilst pretending to shop - but it was fun. Georgia said, "I enjoy learning about money because it will help me for when I'm an adult."

Greeba Castle explored money in a range of ways.

"I've now learnt how to convert pounds to pence. I had to use my keeping going muscle all week!" Benjamin


"I've used my improving muscle this week to learn new skills." Scarlett

They used their questioning and making links muscles when looking at coins and notes from the past.

This created discussion about the different currencies around the world and how those currencies have changed over time.





In Year 5/6 we explored the concept of 'a budget' and considered things we needed to buy compared to things we might want to buy. We looked at how we could adjust spending to save more money to buy bigger things. We also planned a cinema trip and pizza night applying a budget and realised that not spending too much was harder than we expected!



World Book Day

The day began with a whole school assembly. Congratulations to all our pupils for successfully taking on the challenge of a choral retelling and acting out of the story of 'We're Going on A Bear Hunt'.



Both pupils and staff enjoyed dressing up as book characters - many amongst us unrecognisable! We spent the day buddying up, sharing books and enjoying time spent on reading.
