




Rushen Primary School

Year 1 recently welcomed visitors who taught them all about road safety as a pedestrian. They were given lots of information about how to stay safe when crossing the roads and they learnt all about zebra crossings and traffic lights.

Everyone was able to demonstrate that they understood how to cross a road safely. The children learned the key steps to keeping safe and enjoyed chanting 'STOP, LOOK, LISTEN, THINK' ask the question 'Is it SAFE?'. Then KEEP looking and listening as you cross! Crossing the road safely involves eyes, ears, mouth and brain!



The children loved practising crossing a model road laid out for their use, and all knew how to find a safe place to cross and where to stand on the pavement not TOO close to the road!

Thank you so much to Anna for taking the time to join us for an assembly and for sharing the great work being done by the Manx Birdlife Trust.




We enjoyed meeting her singing birds and there was much to learn about current projects and local wildlife.
