Dear Parents/Carers,

The children are now fully engaged with their learning. This year we aim to ensure that the 6Rs and Learning Muscles are applied to learning and are as important as the objective of each lesson; this is called 'split screen thinking'. The 6R dispositions are central to learning and the Learning Muscles are the skills that help children to achieve a particular disposition. These are life-long skills.

I would like to thank parents for the kind messages and positive feedback regarding the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings and the information packs that were picked up on the night, regarding learning and the curriculum. I hope that holding the meetings at separate times allowed you to attend all of the meetings for your family. Many parents have also made use of the appointments each Thursday to meet the teacher and discuss their child's progress.

We are looking forward to the events we have planned for the rest of the term which are outlined below. Representatives from the 'Friends of Rushen' and a number of other parents met with me to discuss a number of exciting events to take place throughout the year. Remembrance Day – WW1 Centenary

We plan to visit the beach in order to undertake learning in a range of subjects including art, literacy, science and maths, to name but a few.











Hop Tu Naa



Last year's Hop Tu Naa celebration was a success as all pupils and staff took part. The highlight was definitely the fantastic carved 'moots' that you worked on at home with your children. As you know, at Rushen Primary School we like to celebrate 'everything Manx'. Hop Tu Naa is a very old custom that tells us a lot about Manx traditions and is an opportunity to have some fun!

We will celebrate 'Hop Tu Naa' at school this year on the last day of this half term, <u>Friday 26th October</u>.

Expectations for the day

- Children should come to school dressed in something appropriate for 'Hop Tu Naa' this could be as a witch, wizard, or other traditional Manx costume. Children must not come dressed in football kit or superhero costumes, for example.
- ★ If the children do not wish to come to school dressed up as the suggestions above, they must wear school uniform.
- ★ We will not charge anything or raise money through this event, this time.
- ★ Please bring in a carved turnip/swede, which the family can produce together. We will place them on tables in the Main Hall and classes will have the opportunity to view them during the day.
- ★ Celebration assembly will happen as usual and children will be able to see each other's costumes.
- In class, children will be learning about the day and customs, comparing celebrations from the past and present and the different types of celebrations around the world etc. Hogmanay, Halloween and Trick or Treat etc.

We have recently sent home Consent Forms, App consent forms and GDPR information. Please ensure you complete and sign ALL of the forms as requested. Some families have returned the forms with one signed and the other not signed. This is taking Mrs Awkal a very long time to process and we are having to return the unsigned sheets to you.

School Meals

For those who pay half termly, school meals will cost £78.75 from half term until the Christmas holiday. This amount should be paid on the first Monday after half term, 5th November. There are a few families who remain in arrears with dinner money – please would you send any outstanding payments to school immediately. A new school dinner menu is attached for your information.

We currently have several pupils in school who are severely allergic to nuts. All our school dinners are nut free, however, we would ask that you do not include nuts or nut based products in packed lunches for any pupil. For those who are severely allergic, anaphylaxis may be triggered by being in close proximity to nuts/nut products. Thank you for your support.

Thank you for your understanding in letting the secondary school pupils have their photos taken first – this meant they could still be on time for school. The children were all very well behaved while waiting for their photographs to be taken and our photographer, Mr Morrison, commented on this. Visit from Rowan Henthorn, Marine Scientist



The children were enthralled during our visit from Marine Scientist, Rowan. She is an Ambassador for the UNESCO Biosphere, a mentor for 'a life less plastic' and an Ambassador for the Manx Youth organisation.

Rowan spoke to us about plastics and how they are harming the environment and endangering animals around the world. She told the children about when she sailed across the north Pacific Ocean to research the devastating impact of single use plastic. The children demonstrated their excellent knowledge of the issues associated with

plastics and thoroughly enjoyed the session. We have asked Rowan to return to help us with our eco projects and hope to undertake some science work at our beach.
