Some of you may have seen the distressing headline in the Manx Independent last week. The story indicates that photos of young women have been harvested from social media sites and uploaded to a 'porn' site. The photos are not indecent but some do depict girls in school uniforms and some names have been added.

It would seem prudent to send out a reminder to all pupils and parents about the need to update privacy settings on social media sites regularly and also to think before posting any photos online. We all take online safety seriously and it is crucial that we remind everyone to look after themselves online. Many of you are already signed up to the Safer Schools App and this would be a great place to start for advice and guidance.
