## Welcome back to the new school year 2020-21!

Welcome as always, to our returning families and to all of our new families who have joined us for the first time! We had 42 new starters in our Reception this year, as well as a number of other children joining us across the classes in different year groups. Although we have almost 300 pupils at Rushen Primary School, we are proud of our 'family feel' and school community focus. The children have made a wonderful start to the new school year and are looking very smart in their uniforms. Thank you for your efforts with uniform and particularly with black shoes. If you have any issues, please write a note to the teacher. The children should only bring trainers to wear at playtime so that the mud from the field doesn't get brought into school. ### Any worries or questions? Just let us know!

Please contact the class teacher in the first instance with any questions or concerns, when you pick your child up at the end of the day or via telephone. Please leave a voicemail if necessary and we will get back to you as soon as we can.

You can make an appointment to see your child's class teacher most days after school and on a Thursday morning when you can discuss any questions or concerns and find out about your child's learning. We are happy to be flexible and can also do telephone appointments if you are unable to pop in to school.

If your child has a medical/dental appointment, a written note should be given to your child's teacher who will make a note on our system. Please be aware that Mrs Awkal has many administrative tasks and responsibilities and is our only member of office staff. If you need to speak to someone in the School Office please leave a voicemail and we will get back to you as soon as possible. Please note that Mrs Awkal may not always be based in the Office. It is crucial that you update your contact information when something changes. We <u>MUST</u> be able to contact you in an emergency.

# **EYFS upgrades**







Phase 1 - Removal of the original fence, new fence built to incorporate a larger grassed area. New wooden fencing attached to the original metal fence to stop equipment rolling away.

Phase 2 – Completion of the wooden/metal fence, building of a mud kitchen and sand pits and the creation of a shelter for play.





Phase 1 included the removal of panels, removal of work surface, electrical sockets, sink, the re-siting of pipe work and the re-siting of fire safety arrangements.

Phase 2 will include flooring and decoration upgrades.

### 6R Boodi

### Readiness...

This is the first of our 6Rs and something we ask you to focus on with your child, talking about how they can be ready for school and for learning. Please encourage independence and involve your child in their own preparations.

- Children need to be in school every day. They should arrive on time for the school day at 8:45am (8.51am will be marked as late in the Register) and be collected promptly at 3:30pm (Reception pupils at 3.25pm). Children who arrive early must be supervised by parents/carers. Teachers have commitments before and after school so are not available to provide supervision at these times. Children should be made aware of end of school pick up arrangements before they leave for school. If there is an emergency and parents are going to be late, please contact school in advance in order to share your alternative arrangements.
- ✓ Coats it is essential that all children bring a suitable coat (named) with a hood, to school every day. <u>The</u> children will be going out in all weathers unless it is extremely wet.
- Uniform children should wear a maroon sweatshirt/cardigan with the school's logo, white polo shirt, black/grey skirt or trousers, black school shoes (NOT trainers). Each item must be named. No jewellery, except a watch and stud earrings (no hoops etc.), is allowed. Long hair should always be tied up with a simple hair band (no large bows or bands). Children must not wear make-up or nail varnish to school. Please ensure skirts are not too short as the children sit on benches and will be moving about in their uniform during learning activities this will also be outside
- ✓ Water Bottle children must bring a water bottle and these must **ONLY** contain water.
- ✓ Please ensure that PE kit is named and that it stays in school every day to afford flexibility for our timetable. Stud earrings must be removed or covered with tape from home for PE lessons.
- ✓ School dinners **MUST** be paid for in advance through ParentPay.
- Please read all newsletters and written communications that are sent home you may need to encourage your child to tell you when they have letters from school. We are encouraging the children to be independent.

### 'Meet the Teacher' meetings

'Meet the Teacher' meetings are underway this week. We hope that all parents/carers attend to find out about how the children will learn, how the classroom is managed, how you can help at home and whole school expectations. <u>Please note that the parent meetings for Reception Classes will be held later in the term</u>.

### **Curriculum and Assessment Information/Learning at Rushen**

A pack of information will be added to the website under the 'Learning at Rushen' tab along with the Curriculum Overview Sheet for each class for this term. This will include details of the themes the children will be learning, the 'Learning at Rushen' letter, National Curriculum Assessment information, how you can help at home and information about the 6Rs and Learning Muscles.

The website now holds a lot of information about learning, home learning activities (learning sequences that have been carefully planned to follow the school curriculum, differentiated and which ensure learning progression), links to websites of interest and much more! Dip in and see what's there or read everything to find out more!

We will send an email with some links to enable you to access the updated documents which we have improved for this year.

### Prefects

As part of our focus on 'everyone a leader', we choose Y6 pupils to be 'Prefects'. All children were asked if they wanted to apply in the Summer Term, some did and wrote fantastic letters of application. All 14 pupils were successful. The second group of Prefects will be chosen by the class teachers. We are hoping that every child in Year 6 meets the criteria and if they do, they will be able to be a Prefect at some point this year.

Next week, the Headteacher will be leading a Leadership development course for Prefects.

- can communicate well with others and build positive, meaningful relationships, exercising common sense and sensitivity when dealing with other children
- has an excellent attitude to learning, positive and enthusiastic, encouraging and motivating fellow pupils
- ✓ plays an active part in the life of the school
- $\checkmark$  has the ability to take initiative and follow instructions
- ✓ is co-operative, helpful, well-mannered, trustworthy, kind and responsible
- ✓ is respectful towards teachers, peers, and the school environment
- $\checkmark$  treats other pupils fairly, without showing favour to friends or relatives
- $\checkmark$  is an excellent ambassador for the school, representing the school at events

#### Job Description:

- ✓ contribute to the school newsletter
- encourage other children to demonstrate 'what we do around here', eg. walking in the corridors calmly and quietly, show respect to
  others, use restorative practice (talk through our problems to find solutions) etc
- ✓ work with classes during wet break times or lunch times to engage other children in activities
- ✓ show visitors around the school
- ✓ assist at school fairs and events
- $\checkmark$  support in the dining hall and when lining up for lunch
- ✓ support children to line up quietly outside
- ✓ undertake (be punctual for) duties, keep to plans and rotas and attend all Prefect meetings
- ✓ be able to speak confidently to children, parents, staff and visitors
- $\checkmark$  to act as a friend and Buddy for those who need support

### Reminders

#### **School Dinners**

We encourage all children to have a school dinner. We have wonderful kitchen staff who cook fresh and healthy options. Pupils may choose daily from a healthy hot meal menu and a salad bar. We believe that this is good value for money when compared to buying ingredients for a packed lunch.

**Please ensure school dinners are paid for in advance via ParentPay,** there are a number of families who are currently in debt on their school dinner account. If you have not yet signed up for ParentPay and require a reminder of your activation code, please ask Mrs Awkal in the School Office.

Should your child decide to swap from school dinners to packed lunches or vice versa, please give the class teacher one week's notice in advance (in a written note), so that we can alert the kitchen and arrange for meal charges to be stopped/started for your child.

School dinners this term cost £77.55 until half term, £159.80 until the end of term, £441.80 for the school year or £11.75 per 5 day week.

Medical

Inhalers (named) <u>must</u> be left in school every day. Children will take these with them if they go out of school for any reason.

Asthma forms were sent home last week with all pupils who have an inhaler in school. It is vital that this information is kept up to date and we would be grateful if you could complete and return the form to school immediately if you have not already done so. Please ensure that any updates are communicated to school immediately.

#### **Expectations for the day**

 $\star$  If the children do not wish to come to school dressed up as the suggestions above, they must wear school uniform.

★ Please bring in a carved MOOT (turnip/swede), which the family can produce together. We will place them on tables in the Main Hall and classes will have the opportunity to view them during the day.

★ In class, children will be learning about the day and customs, comparing celebrations from the past and present and the different types of celebrations around the world etc. Hogmanay, Halloween and Trick or Treat etc.
