These apps have a minimum age of mostly 13 years, although some are 16 years. We are finding that our children are not old enough to manage their emotions yet and this is impacting on their learning and relationships in school.

# New intake

# **Class Assemblies, School Video and Stay and Learn**

# **Glen Mooar Class**

The children in Glen Mooar Class were very brave, getting up and telling the whole school and the visitors all about their learning. They were motivated and engaged by their history topic of Gods and Mortals. They told us about how they researched information and found out facts about the Gods. They outlined learning muscles which helped them to achieve the 6Rs. They demonstrated what they had learned in Mathematics - decimals, fractions and percentages by singing a song they had learned. # **Dhoon Glen Class**

Dhoon Glen Class used confident and loud voices to share their learning with the audience. They described what they had learned (knowledge, skills and understanding) and how they used their learning muscles. The children were focussed on and excited about their learning and were clearly motivated. They told us about how they were scientists, carrying out investigations about plants and trying out and testing ideas. They told us about the vocabulary that they had been learning and about their work on the planning of the Town Square in Port Erin. Well done Dhoon Glen Class!







### **Bishopscourt Glen Class**

The children did a very good job of describing our school vision which the whole school has been part of designing. The pupils were confident and totally engaged in preparing for the class assembly, using their learning to learn skills. It was clear that the children were motivated and engaged with the topics they were learning about (WW1, Shakespeare and Africa) and shared their learning, reasoning and explaining their thinking. The idea of a news report was a really good one to use as a vehicle for telling us about their learning. Well done Bishopscourt Glen Class!













# **Tholt-y-Will Class**

The children in Tholt-y-Will Class were confident with loud voices. They told us all about the learning they were doing in mathematics using the Maths Mastery approach. This has hooked the pupils in and motivated them, getting them excited about learning Maths. They told us about the vocabulary they were using to describe the properties of shapes, for example, vertices/corners. Songs are really helpful for learning lots of things, including in Maths, as it helps with remembering facts. It was lovely to see pupils enjoying poetry and reading. They also told us about how they used learning muscles to help them when they were learning. Well done, Tholt-y-Will Glen Class!




# **Ballure Glen Class**
