Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you had an enjoyable family TT holiday. The sunshine was fabulous and really helped to make the week a success. We have had a very successful June in school, with weeks of sunshine (until this week!) we have had lots of motivated learning and opportunities for playing out together.

We have also welcomed visitors including the children's poet, Ian Bland. The children thoroughly enjoyed his assembly and workshops and it was a brilliant way of 'kicking off' our Poetry Week. The whole school spent the week reading, writing and performing poetry. An inspiring and creative week!

We have continued with our class assemblies with Glen Helen and Elfin Glen Classes performing for parents/carers and families, followed by stay and learn sessions which gave visitors an insight into how the classroom works and gave them an opportunity to work alongside their child. Thank you for all of the positive feedback following the assemblies and sessions. We are committed to working closely in partnership with you.

As in previous years, a highlight of this term has been the continued work on transition for our youngest pupils and families who are joining us in September. Our staff have been visiting feeder nurseries and meeting our new starters as well as parents and carers visiting us in school. They have really enjoyed having lunch with their child and also having a 'question and answer' session with staff. Our EYFS new starter parent and carer meeting is coming up, where parents will have a chance to look at some of the resources that we use to support Early Years learning as well as hearing about the curriculum and the school. We will also share a bespoke video we have created for our new starters.

PE kit arrangements have worked well this year. As a reminder so that you have plenty of notice for buying new kit for September, please remember that children should come to school dressed in the PE kit uniform on MSR days as they have this year:

- √ a school t-shirt with logo OR plain white/maroon t-shirt (not football kits or bright colours)
- ✓ black shorts
- ✓ school jumper or cardigan over their t-shirt (not a hoodie. Children can wear the Y6 school leaver hoodie when they have it)
- ✓ On cold days, children can wear **black** leggings or joggers/tracksuit bottoms instead of shorts if they wish.
- ✓ Children should wear trainers on PE days and **black** school shoes on the other days.
