

We hope that the sculptures will actively encourage community participation and as a result we will see more recycling, less plastic waste and more members of our community getting out and about and keeping physically and mentally well.

Beach Buddies was founded in October 2006 when two people were walking on Kirk Michael beach with their dogs. Until then no one had any idea of the scale of the environmental problem facing our Island.

Within a few weeks they had collected hundreds of bags of rubbish, some of the materials dating back as far as 30 years.

After operating on a very small scale for several years, Beach Buddies have recruited over 8,000 volunteers to help keep our beaches clean and free from plastic.


Their aim is for everybody in the Isle of Man to feel emotionally empowered and effectively supported with their mental health.

It is important to focus on creating a strong profile with interesting fin and tail shapes.

Each sculpture will be made from fabricated steel with a silvery grey finish.

open mouth that
is big enough for

Each fish will be supported in the air and have an emptying hatch under its belly for emptying.

Use A4 or A3 paper and make sure you fill the page.
Remember that hand-drawn submissions will need to be scanned in to submit.

Please ensure each design is clearly identified to correspond with the information you provide on the entry form.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

This competition is open to all primary schools on the Isle of Man.

There is no limit to the number of entries submitted by each school.

Entries must be submitted via email along with a copy of the attached entry form to fillafishiom@gmail.com by February 19th 2021.

Each school will only be eligible to enter the competition within their geographical zone. One winner from each zone will be chosen by our judging panel and notified during the week commencing 1st March 2021.

The winning school agrees to the use of their name and design image in any publicity material. Any personal data relating to the individual winner, or any other entrants, will be used in accordance with current data protection legislation and will not be used without the entrant's consent.

We will notify you of any unforeseen changes to the competition as soon as possible.
