Read the text a couple of times and answer the questions related to the text.</p>	<p>Measures I can solve word problems involving measures. Choose a worksheet from here or here. Answer the questions on paper/in your book or print the sheets.</p>	<p>Physical I can create a game to stay fit and have fun. Make and play the hands and feet coordination game. Challenge your family and time each other to see who is the fastest! A simpler but similar activity can be found here.</p>

Watch this video then complete the activities at the end of the page. Look around your house for rectangle shapes that you could find the perimeter of. Draw some items and record their perimeter.
