Can you find any of these interesting descriptions in the poem? Why do you think they were used?</p>	<p>Pictographs I can create my own pictograph.</p> <p>Look at the examples of pictographs online. At the bottom of the page are ideas for creating your own. Create a pictograph for one of these things, or use your own idea! See if an adult in your house can read your graph.</p>	<p>Physical I understand the benefits of exercise to keep healthy.</p> <p>Choose some yoga activities from the Cosmic Kids Yoga Youtube Channel.</p>
