<p>Speaking and Listening I can listen closely and use information to problem solve. Play a game of I Spy with someone in your household. You could play this in your home, in the garden or on a walk.</p>	<p>Place Value. I can count in 2s up to 50. Write down each number from 0 to 50 in 2s on sticky notes or pieces of paper. Ask someone in your house to hide them around your house. You then need to go and find them all and put them back in order!</p>	<p>Science I can identify and name some plants. Go for a flower hunt! Can you find some Manx wildflowers? Here is a list of the wildflowers on the Isle of Man: http://www.manxwildflowers.com/species.aspx</p>
<p>Reading I can recognise common tricky words. Read a story of your choice. Can you spot some of the tricky words? How many can you find? Remember: We call them tricky words because we are not able to sound them out to decode, we have to use our remembering skills.</p>	<p>Time I can tell the time to the hour (o'clock) and half past the hour. Practise telling the time using clocks or a watch. You could even draw your own clocks and write the time underneath.</p>	<p>Physical I can show increasing coordination and control and recognise the importance of being active (whilst learning maths at the same time!) Choose one of the maths topics, get moving and practise maths with the Super Movers!</p>
<p>Writing I can write a diary entry. Write a small diary entry into a notebook each day. Write 3 sentences, for example, what you have been doing, what you have enjoyed doing the most or what the weather's been like. Keeping practising your writing will help you to improve. Remember – capital letters, punctuation, adjectives, connectives and finger spaces!</p>	<p>Money I can recognise coins and know the value of different coins. Can you match pennies to different coins? How many pennies would each coin need? You could set up a shop! Make sure you have a price list and shop sign. You could start giving change for items up to 20p.</p>	<p>ICT I can use ICT to support maths learning. Keep learning the times tables for 2s, 5s and 10s. Play 'Hit the Button' to build up your recall of times tables facts.</p>
<p>Word, sentence, grammar I can use alphabetical order. Write the alphabet down the side of the page, one letter on each line. Now, can you think of an animal for each letter? Can you think of any more unusual animals? For example, A – Anteater, B – Bat, C – Cheetah</p>	<p>Multiplication I can double numbers to 20. Doubling is when you add two of the same number together. Can you find doubles of each number up to 20? Use objects to help you work it out. Try these here.</p>	<p>Creative I can recognise and name external parts of plants. Sketch a flower of your choice, you might want to paint your flower or colour it in. Label the parts of the flower, for example – leaf, flower, petal, stem.</p>
<p>Spelling I can spell high frequency words. Choose 10 of the words from your word walls list, choose words you think you need to practise the most. Write a silly sentence for each word! Highlight the word you have used in your sentence.</p>	<p>Fractions I can find and name a half as one of two equal parts of a shape. Find half of different shapes. Remember - when you divide the shape in half, each side must be equal. Try these here.</p>	<p>Get stronger! Can you exercise your fingers and hand muscles every day? You could: practise your cutting skills, do some threading or have some fun with play dough. If you have Lego, how many bricks can you put together in 1 minute?</p>
