<p><b>Speaking and Listening</b> I can play 'Name 5 things' ...</p> <p>that ...smell nice, feel soft, sound nice, are blue, are red, are green, taste sweet, are circular /rectangular/ triangular, are small /big.</p>	<p><b>Place value</b> I can play 'Build a Monster'.</p> <p>Roll a dice and draw a monster on a piece of paper. 1 = head, 2 = eyes, 3 = mouth, 4 = nose, 5 = body, 6 = legs. Practise counting forwards/backwards to 20.</p>	<p><b>Science Theme - 'Animals'</b> I can talk about how animals are similar / different.</p> <p>Use observations, books, the Internet. Make a fact file of some animals (include name, what they eat, where they live, etc). Sort animals by where they live/how many legs, etc.</p>
<p><b>Reading</b> I can Skype /Facetime /videocall a family member to... read them a story of choice. Listen to favourite stories. Who are the characters? Where is the story set? What happens at the beginning /middle /end?</p>	<p><b>Number Recognition</b> I can play a number memory game.</p> <p>Make two sets of simple number cards showing the numbers one to ten. Use the two sets of number cards to play 'Snap'.</p>	<p><b>Physical</b> I can make a fitness station at home.</p> <p>Use skipping/bunny hops/hopping/walking on tiptoe/high knee/toe touches/star jumps/step ups. See Joe Wicks' PE activities <a href="http://www.twinkl.co.uk">www.twinkl.co.uk</a></p>
<p><b>Writing</b> I can write a story based on a favourite story.</p> <p>Change the setting (where the story takes place), the ending or the characters. See link in 'Useful Websites' for storyboard template ideas or 'Pinterest' also has ideas.</p>	<p><b>Addition and subtraction</b> I can investigate number bonds.</p> <p>Work out pairs of numbers which, when added together, total 2/3/4/5/6/7/8/9/10 and 20. Use a 'part - part – whole model'. Go to 'Twinkl' and type in 'part - part – whole template'.</p>	<p><b>ICT</b> I can use ICT for a learning purpose.</p> <p>Use ICT to research animals, or for a choice of educational activities listed below.</p>
<p><b>Word, sentence, grammar</b> I can read and unscramble simple sentences.</p> <p>Ask an adult to write some sentences which are jumbled up and then write them out correctly with full stops and capital letters. e.g. Monday . Today is / I a have . cat / The is . blue sky</p>	<p><b>Addition and subtraction</b> I can match number sentences to pictures.</p> <p>Create number sentences using dice or found objects to add or subtract. Draw it and then write it. E.g Draw 2 groups of 3 pencils, then write the sentence to match your drawing <math>3 + 3 = 6</math></p>	<p><b>Creative</b> I can plan and choose resources to create a 3D model.</p> <p>Use cardboard boxes and packaging to make a model. Maybe you could make a model of an animal. Discuss the different shapes you use. Which are easiest to build with? Take a photo or draw your model.</p>
<p><b>Spelling</b> I can use <a href="http://www.phonicsplay.co.uk">www.phonicsplay.co.uk</a> ...</p> <p>to find my phonics phase and practise letters and sounds. Practise spellings of high frequency words (word wall lists have been sent home and are on the school website)</p>	<p><b>Measures and shape</b> I can choose vocabulary to describe shapes.</p> <p>Make a collection of small 2D/3D objects and hide them in a bag. Put your hand in the bag and describe the shape of an object to see if an adult can guess it.
