We should learn to use alternative words. Use a thesaurus (can be online) to find as many different words for 'said' as you can. For a further challenge, write your words in sentences.</p>	<p>Money I can recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.</p> <p>Watch this video coin. We can use English coins on the Isle of Man, but we also use our own coins which are very similar. Find one of every coin (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2) and using a pencil, do some coin rubbings on a piece of paper and label each coin.</p>	<p>Science I can make observations of animals.</p> <p>Watch this video. What makes each group of animals different? You will need to look out for punctuation marks, including: speech marks, exclamation marks, full stops and commas. As you read, also look out for words which the author has used to avoid using the word 'said'.</p>	<p>Money I can recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.</p> <p>Watch this video. On the Isle of Man we have our own money notes, but they are the same value as the English notes. Follow the activity at the end of the video and pause it to answer the questions.</p>	<p>Physical I can recognise the importance of being active and describe how my body feels.</p> <p>Join in with Andy's Wild Workouts!</p> <p>How does it make you feel when you do exercise? Think about how you feel both mentally and physically.</p>												
<p>Writing I can use descriptive phrases well.</p> <p>Imagine you have discovered a mystery door to a magical land. Draw a picture of what you can see and write a description of your setting. Use your imaginary senses to describe everything you can see, smell, hear and feel. Example: In the colourful, majestic land it smells as sweet as candy floss and I can hear water loudly gushing down the steep, sparkling waterfall.</p>	<p>Money I can recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p) and combine amounts to make a specific value.</p> <p>Practise making amounts of money on the Toy Shop Money Game.</p>	<p>History I can use the Internet to find out about the past.</p> <p>Use the Internet to find out how money in England and the Isle of Man has changed over time. Make a poster to share the information you have found. Include: A title, pictures, facts and labels.</p>												
<p>Word, sentence, grammar I can use adverbs to add description to my writing.</p> <p>Adverbs add more information and description. Watch this video about using adverbs in a sentence. Use these adverbs in your own sentences: <i>gracefully, carefully, viciously, softly, noisily, cheerfully</i>.</p>	<p>Mental Maths I can recall the multiplication tables.</p> <p>Practise the 2x, 5x and 10x tables on Hit the Button. For further challenge, practise the 3x and 4x tables.</p>	<p>Creative I can record ideas as sketches.</p> <p>A money box is often in the shape of a pig, called a 'piggy bank'. This is often thought to be because in Chinese culture, pigs symbolise wealth and good fortune. Follow this tutorial to draw a pig!</p>												
<p>Spelling I can spell words using specific phonemes, within my phonics phase.</p> <p>Log in on Phonics Bloom and choose a game you would like to play to practise your phonics phase.</p>	<p>Mental Maths I can add using mental strategies.</p> <p>Play the Mental Maths Train to practise adding on mentally.
