Draw and label any shapes you have not seen or heard of before with a pencil and a ruler. Do you know the difference between regular and irregular shapes?</p>	<p>Science I can identify ways humans can stay healthy, and give examples.</p> <p>Work through the page about staying healthy. Design a poster explaining to others the importance of staying healthy and how they can do it, using examples such as types of exercise, and a balanced diet.</p>
<p>Reading I can draw inference from the characters' feelings, actions, motives and justify it with evidence from the text.</p> <p>Complete the BBC bitesize page on Inference. Watch the videos, and complete the activities.</p>	<p>Shape I can compare geometric shapes based on their properties and sizes.</p> <p>Complete the online lesson from the Oak National Academy.</p>	<p>Physical I can improvise with ideas and movements.</p> <p>Watch the video showing African dancing. Create your own dance using the strong, arm movements shown in the video. Find something in your house that you can use as a drum?</p>
<p>Writing I can create detailed settings to engaged the reader and add atmosphere.</p> <p>Look at the picture on Pobble365 about the monastery. Complete the 'sentence challenge' activity. Once you have gathered ideas, complete the 'story starter' activity, describing what the character can see from his window in as much detail as possible.</p>	<p>Symmetry I can identify lines of symmetry in 2D shapes.</p> <p>Watch the video song about lines of symmetry. Use Geoboard to create a variety of 2D shapes. Using a different coloured line, draw a line of symmetry across your shapes. Take a screenshot of your work. Here's an example.</p>	<p>Geography I can describe a place using information I have found</p> <p>Explore this website about wonders in our World. Choose one and create a travel guide explaining where in the world to find it. Think about its country, how large it is, and if it is crowded or remote. Is it far from the Isle of Man? Use pictures and facts in your guide.</p>
<p>Word, sentence, grammar I can use a wider range of conjunctions, which are sometimes in different positions within a sentence.</p> <p>Watch the video about conjunctions. Go onto Pobble365 and find the section 'Sick Sentences'. Add more information to the sentences, using conjunctions. Here are some examples of conjunctions for you.</p>	<p>Symmetry I can identify lines of symmetry in 2D shapes in different orientations.</p> <p>Read through this page. Complete the worksheet, trying to find a variety of symmetrical lines. Remember, some shapes have multiple lines of symmetry!</p>	<p>Creative I can generate ideas and recognise that my designs have to meet a range of different needs.</p> <p>Chichén itzá is 24 metres high and has 365 steps, one for each day of the year. Design your own pyramid, using items you can find in your house. Think about the materials you will use, how large it will be and make sure you label your design.</p>
<p>Spelling I can spell words using apostrophes.</p> <p>Spellzone. Practise spelling common words using apostrophes using the 'learn' section. What would each word be without the apostrophes?</p>	<p>Symmetry I can complete a simple symmetric figure.</p> <p>Read the page completing a symmetrical figure.
